## Centering participation and innovation: the Citizen Science Strategy 2030 for Germany

Citizen science offers benefits to both science and society. While researchers can directly profit from the collection of huge data sets or the input of public knowledge, projects that include citizen scientists also strengthen public trust and interest in science. In the last few years, participation in citizen science has seen a sharp increase in Germany. Its potential for innovation has also been recognized by the German government: citizen science is prominently placed in the coalition agreement, and the Federal Ministry of Research and Education (BMBF) has been funding major projects and initiatives.

The Citizen Science Strategy 2030 for Germany identifies 15 groundbreaking action areas – from funding instruments to data management – and provides an overview of the citizen science landscape in Germany. Written with the help of 219 persons from 136 organisations, the strategy has one aim: "to strengthen Citizen Science by 2030 in order to unleash its innovative potential for science, society and politics." ### Plastic Pirates tackle water pollution

Plastic Pirates, a youth-driven initiative which started in Germany and has expanded into 12 other countries due to its success, is pioneering the documentation of plastic waste in Europe's water bodies. With over 15,000 participants in Germany alone, this project serves as a vital research asset: its findings uncover the diverse sources of water pollution, from macroplastics like fishing nets to microplastics originating from larger items' breakdown. By empowering young minds and emphasizing community action, the initiative raises awareness but also contributes essential data – aligning with the EU's mission to restore our oceans and waters by 2030.

# Germany hosts record number of international exchange students

Germany has achieved third place globally for hosting 370,000 international exchange students in the 2022/23 winter semester. Federal Minister of Research and Education Bettina Stark-Watzinger praises support programmes like My GUIDE and HAW.International and highlights Germany's appeal based on strong career prospects and the lack of tuition fees. Germany is also successful in retaining graduates and attracting international researchers: 70,000 academics from around the world attest to its status as a key academic hub.


#### Excellence Strategy boosts German university research globally

The Excellence Strategy (ExStra), funded by German federal and state governments, enhances the global competitiveness of German universities and further elevates their research. With an increase of its budget to 687 million euros for 2026 and 2027, the strategy is amplifying its efforts to support its Clusters and Universities of Excellence. While Clusters of Excellence promote project-specific collaboration among top scientists in internationally competitive research areas, funding for Universities of Excellence strengthens institutions as a whole. So far, the strategy has supported 57 Clusters of Excellence and 10 Universities of Excellence as well as one University Consortium of Excellence. # German citizen science research prize celebrates collaborative excellence

A new "Knowledge of the Many" research prize for citizen science in Germany invites nominations recognizing outstanding scientific work in this field. The prize, with awards of 20,000, 10,000 and 5,000 euros for the top three winners, aims to support projects that advance citizen science. The prize money enables the award winners to further expand their activities. This year's winners cover our planet's surface, oceans and stratosphere: from light pollution and agroforestry systems to beach debris – citizen science was essential to their research success.
